The following is important information if your child needs to come to school. The guidelines are designed to help us do our best for your child and to meet the government expectations of an 'alert level 3.'

We will be contacting all parents and whanau on Thursday 23rd and Friday 24th April. **You must let us know** if your child will be coming to school by Friday April 24th.

On Tuesday 28th of April your child will be allocated a classroom and this is where they will spend their school day. School will start on Wednesday April 29th. Please note that we expect that social distancing protocols will be observed when arriving at or leaving school.

Your child will:

- Need to bring the chromebook they have been using at home, as they will be continuing with their distance learning programme planned by their usual classroom teacher.
- Need to bring morning tea, lunch and a drink bottle with water.
- Be supervised by a teacher(s) and support staff to complete their allocated learning tasks
- Remain within limited bubbles of contact at school e.g. distancing guidelines in classrooms and depending on numbers, different break times
- Need to maintain high levels of hygiene practices e.g. hand washing, coughing and sneezing into elbows
- Not be allowed to play sport that requires contact or sharing of equipment with other students (including playgrounds)
- We ask that you consider the impact on other potentially vulnerable people in your bubble (and that of others) if your child comes to school.
